**SHED YOUR CAR DAY IS ON AGAIN!!**

**Fremantle is celebrating its second car-free day on Wednesday  
September 19,  
to coincide with World Car Free Day**

Once again Fremantle residents and commuters will be encouraged to 'shed their cars' and enjoy the social, environmental and health benefits of walking, cycling and taking public transport.

The car-free concept is already an annual event in many countries around the world. Last year, 800 towns and cities in 23 countries across Europe, Japan and North America closed their streets to motor traffic in a one day experiment. An estimated 70 million people rose to the Car Free Day challenge, discovering their hometowns and cities by foot, bicycle or public transport. The 2000 initiative followed on from the success of *In Town Without My Car*, held across Europe on 22 September 1999. This event attracted participation from 22 million people, and 85% of those surveyed expressed support for the event to be repeated regularly. In 1999, Paris closed down some 40 miles of roads to motor-traffic, and people simply could not believe how tranquil their cities could be without cars for a few hours. 44% of people said they wanted a car free day every week!

Last year's **Shed Your Car** event in Fremantle was Australia's first, initiated by the City of Fremantle as part of its sustainability agenda.

The objectives of Shed Your Car day are:

- encouraging behaviour change toward reduced car use;
- increase awareness of environmental issues such as air pollution, noise pollution and congestion caused by private cars;
- recognition of the health benefits of walking and cycling;
- creating more space for pedestrians and cyclists;
- encouraging more people to experience public transport options;
- encouraging a greater sense of community and safety within Fremantle;
- demonstrating the benefit to business of reduced car traffic in Fremantle;
- supporting the Fremantle City Plan objective for a sustainable city;
- supporting and encouraging other communities to recognise the benefits of similar events.

Following the success of last year's inaugural Shed Your Car Day, the City of Fremantle, working in conjunction with a Community Advisory Group, has once again received the support of a wide range of sponsors and local businesses for this year's event, including **the Department of Planning & Infrastructure's TravelSmart and Cycle Instead programs, Transperth and the Cycling Promotion Fund.**

Local traders and businesses also make tremendous contributions, either as cash, prizes or services in kind which help the event run within its limited budget. This year there will be some fantastic promotional opportunities for traders and organisations which are keen to sponsor or support the day and be a part of it.

## ON THE DAY

South Terrace-Market Street (from High Street to Norfolk Street) will be closed to private vehicles *and buses* from 6.30am to 6.30pm. Access will be available for emergency vehicles, cyclists and delivery vehicles.

Bus services that normally run in South Terrace (Routes 98, 99, 126, 135, 136, 138, 141, 144, 145, 510, 920 and the Fremantle CAT service) will be detoured during the road closures. Northbound buses will detour via Parry Street, with a temporary stop near the Fremantle Markets. Outbound buses will detour via Phillimore Street, Mouat Street, Marine Terrace and Norfolk Street with a temporary stop near Croke Street. Parking will be banned on the east side of Mouat Street to assist bus movements.

Once the streets have been closed, the community will reclaim the streets with a range of exciting events, including:

- **A Bike to Breakfast (6.30 - 9am):**

Supported by the Department of Planning & Infrastructure's **Cycle Instead** program and local cafés, the first three hundred cyclists to arrive on the Café strip will receive a voucher for a coffee and muffin (or equivalent to the value of \$5) at one of the participating cafés.

- **Workplace Challenge:**

Opportunities for small and large organisations and businesses in Fremantle to participate in the day in a very active way, and win fun prizes at the same time. Sponsored by **Transperth**.

##### • **Slow Bike Race:**

This was a huge success last year – lots of giggles to see who can stay on their bike the longest while covering a very short distance! Much more difficult than it sounds!

##### • **Reclaim the Streets March: 5.30**

The day will close with a colourful Street March led by the popular entertainment troupe Freo Samba, which last year culminated in some very creative dancing in the Street!

Research\* conducted during last year's event revealed the following successful outcomes:

Just 42% of respondents arrived by car on the day, with use of public transport high at 36%. Cyclists and pedestrians made up 11%.

When compared to research from both Fremantle and the Perth Metropolitan Inner Region these figures demonstrate Shed Your Car Day had a very positive effect on people's choice of transport.

For example, a recent travel survey of Fremantle residents shows that 52% normally travel in their car as driver, with a further 23% travelling in a car as passenger. Of the remainder, 13% of trips are on foot, 9% are by public transport and 3% are by bicycle.

Figures from Shed Your Car Day also compare favourably with figures from the Perth Metropolitan Inner Region with 76% using their car to get to work, 11% using public transport, and 7% cycling and walking.

Overall, there was a **71% reduction of traffic** in South Terrace on Shed Your Car (up to 90% in peak hour) which resulted in a significant improvement in **air quality (particulates)** - in particular a **reduction in maximum particulate emissions** of 11.6%.

Many local traders were beneficiaries, – overall there were **35% more people using local establishments** (café/retail) than in the previous week. In fact, at 8am on Shed Your Car Day, there was a 61% increase – people were obviously attracted to the car-free, fume-free Cappuccino Strip for breakfast!

Support for the event was extremely positive, and it is clear that the day was a success when measured against all objectives. Importantly, 97% of respondents interviewed on the day thought the event should be repeated again, **citing less cars, less fumes** and easier access as the main reasons it was successful.

Expanding on this success, the University of Western Australia is conducting its own “Shed Your Car Day” this year, to coincide with the event in Fremantle – an event which is gathering momentum locally, interstate and overseas. “Shed Your Car Day” organisers from the City of Fremantle have been in discussions with the Cities of Melville, Cottesloe and Subiaco here in WA; as well as Adelaide, Brisbane, Christchurch and as far away as Paris. Enthusiastic support has come from all locations – more shedding of cars is definitely on the horizon!

***Increased community awareness and the opportunity to build on new and existing sponsor relationships promises an even bigger and better “Shed Your Car Day” in 2001.***
